## Message from The Principal



Dear Parents,

In 1996, archaeologists working in South Africa discovered a set of footprints in sandstone. Analysis of these footprints now suggest that they were made by a woman just under 5 feet tall, walking towards a lagoon shortly after a rain downpour. It is estimated that this took place approximately 117000 years ago. We know very little about the person but what is certain is that he or she had no idea that her footprints would be still be discussed over a hundred thousand years later. At assembly this morning, we discussed the impact that so many have made upon us all this year. As the year draws to a close, it has been interesting to reflect on our actions and the events of this year which have left an impact, often unintended, on others.

As always, there have been many challenges yet, despite these, the school has continued to thrive. This was best captured by our accreditation this week as a High Performance Learning World Class School — a recognition which has so far only been given to thirteen schools worldwide. All staff here have worked so hard throughout the year, focussing unremittingly on the students and ensuring that they are able to realise their potential and achieve at the very highest levels. We await the results in August, but I know we can look forward with a sense of confident anticipation.




## **New Canteen Provider from September**

From September 2019 **Slices** will be the canteen provider.

Details of the Slices sample menu, nutritional information and online system payment guidelines can be found on the D6 communicator.

With regards to refunds from this year's credit on student accounts with the current canteen provider, all students that have not been able to run down their credit, will receive refunds. Details of this will be communicated in August.



In order to access the new canteen services next year parents are required to register their details online with the Slices portal and will receive a Slices access card.

REGISTRATION & PAYMENT INFORMATION

Parents register online and top up their child's account to enable them to start using their SlicesCard. Every time the card is presented at a till, the balance is displayed and this lets pupils know how much money they have available.


