What is the difference between GCSE Business Studies and GCSE Economics?

Both are closely related and there is a large degree of cross-ever between the subjects, but in differing contexts. Business studies is the broad examination of management and the business world, this includes a range of areas such as Marketing, Finance, Enterprise, Human Resources and Economics. Business Studies is, by its very nature, more applied to real-world contexts and real businesses.

Economics is the more narrowly defined study of the Economic Problem and therefore the related decision-making process that it generates. Importantly, we study both at Micro (individual markets) and Macro (larger aggregate contexts) levels. Economics is a deep dive into the academic aspects of the discipline.
