

Year 13 - Celina Labbaci 13G2


Celina is great fun and holds the form together with her positive and bubbly energy. She quietly gets on with all tasks set and always completes them to the best of her ability. Well done Celina!

Neurodiversity week

Jumeirah College celebrated our first Neurodiversity week in March 2022. We held many events across the school community raising awareness around the strengths and challenges people with special education needs can experience.

Events

We delivered training to our school community. Sessions were provided for students, teachers, parents and the Support for Learning department. These sessions allow up to update our skill set and continue to promote inclusion across the school.

Podcast

Podcast recorded with Lani Allan, University of Royal Holloway. Topics included the UCAS application, wellbeing and what support students with special education needs can expect in university.

Training for Students

Assemblies: We held assemblies across all year groups. These assemblies covered special education needs such a dyslexia, autism, dyspraxia and ADHD. Students were given activities that allowed them to consider what it might feel like to have ADHD.

They saw some of the famous animals that are there and also got to see the new baby sloth, Lemon! This consolidated their learning from science, where they learned about Animal Care.
